1 What is happening to MoneySense and CareerSense?

NatWest MoneySense and CareerSense are evolving into NatWest Thrive – a new, flexible learning programme designed with teachers, for teachers. ① I'd planned to run a MoneySense session this/next term, is that not possible now?

If you've already booked a MoneySense workshop then that will go ahead but we're no longer taking future bookings.

② What's happening from April to June with the new pilot volunteer offering?

Between April and June, we are running a pilot volunteer programme to define our new approach to volunteering. This pilot will temporarily replace our existing offering. We will use this period to test, learn, and refine our workshops, creating an even better, volunteer-led experience ready for full launch in September.

③ Can we book new workshops during the pilot period (April-June)?

We will temporarily pause new bookings during this pilot period as we refine our new approach. However, don't worry you won't have to wait too long – we will re-open bookings at the start of Autumn term.

④ What are NatWest Thrive Live events?



NatWest Thrive Live events are interactive full-day sessions, that help young people turn possibilities into progress by building their financial confidence, developing their career skills, and helping them be future-ready. Scheduled for May and September, these workshops will connect students with bank colleagues to build financial confidence, develop career skills, and prepare for the future. We will test our approach to these events in May ready for launch from September this year with bookings opening for September events at the beginning of May.

5 Can our school participate in the pilot programme?

We are reaching out to schools in our network and will be in touch if you're within one of our key pilot catchment areas.

6 How can we register our interest in workshops from September onwards?

Schools interested in scheduling workshops for September and beyond can register their interest when bookings re-open at the start of the Autumn term.

7 Who delivers these workshops?

Trained NatWest Thrive Volunteers lead each session, sharing valuable insights from their personal and professional experiences.

8 How long is each workshop?

Each session typically lasts about 50 minutes, making it suitable for regular school scheduling.

9 Is there a cost involved for schools? (£)

No, these workshops are entirely free to schools.

10 What resources are needed from the school?

We request a suitable space equipped with a screen or projector. All other materials will be provided by our volunteers.

11 Can we book more than one workshop?

Absolutely! We encourage multiple bookings to maximize impact across different classes or year groups.

12 What happens after the workshop?

We will gather feedback to continuously refine our offering and ensure we meet your school's educational goals. Follow-up resources and support materials are also available for further learning.
